

The Little Miami High School Choirs are committed to outstanding work as well as connecting to one another to form a community that is welcome to all singers. A theme is established and developed throughout the year to embrace this philosophy. Repertoire from the Renaissance to modern music is chosen to support various facets of the theme in hopes of creating new ways for students to understand thoughts evoked by the text and find their own connections to them. This provides an opportunity for students to grow musically in technical ability, as well as in the areas of emotion and empathy.



Our theme this year, *The Journey Home*, evolved from conversations with last year's members - many of them, seniors. These seniors discussed their journey from the beginning of their freshman year when we were returning in the midst of COVID. We were masked, we sang under the stadium bleachers, and we were only permitted to have one concert. The journey began this fall as the LMHS choirs shared songs about rivers - referencing our place along the Little Miami River and the Ohio River. Holiday concerts provided us with "Joy on the Journey." In March, we held onto the "Journey Through the Storm." And, finally, for the year's finale, we will be "Home." As the years have passed, we have returned to performing in venues throughout the community, the state, and beyond. It has indeed been a "journey" for all of us- through the treacherous waves and smooth waters. Through it all, it is good to return home safely.

First-grade music class consists of lots of movement, rhythmic playing and singing. The primary focus is basic rhythm reading. The students are fluent in reading, performing and playing the quarter note, quarter rest and eighth note rhythms. They also learn about proper vocal singing practices, the musical alphabet and form in music. All this content is taught and practiced through movement and rhythm instrument usage. They have also learned what it is to be a respectful audience member. They practice this by watching their peers perform. Students spend time learning their songs and dialogue for their concerts. The students love the opportunity to perform in a larger concert setting.

COURSE INFORMATION

LMMS - Visual Arts Program

Sixth grade students at Little Miami Middle School experience different mediums and experiment with their many uses. They start by discussing, "What art means to me?" While also learning what art means to other masters and contemporaries of creativity. This foundation creates an atmosphere of personal discovery for each student, while they apply color theory, the elements of art and the principles of art and design to their projects. Out of the box thinking is encouraged as they take each masterpiece to a next level status when stepping out of their comfort zone. Using a basis of abstraction, students find their unique style of creative expression.



LMMS - 7th and 8th Grade Art

In 7th and 8th grade art, students work to push their creative and artistic skills through creating various 2D, 3D and digital art projects while gaining knowledge of art terms and artists.



Advanced Painting

In Advanced Painting, students explore the mediums of oil, watercolor, acrylic paints and their unique applications in composition. Artworks from various artists and cultures through time, are utilized as a source of inspiration and understanding of the medium and subject matter.

Advanced Ceramics

Advanced ceramics focuses on the art of throwing pottery on the wheel, using a variety of molding methods and creating clay pieces by hand. This course discusses the history of wheel-thrown pottery and a more intensive study of glazing techniques. Works from different cultures and time periods as well as those created by the students are studied.

COURSE INFORMATION

Drawing

Basic Drawing focuses on drawing skills and techniques. Students study proportion, shading, blending and perspective to explore and create original personal images using a variety of drawing media, including pencil, colored pencil, pastels, pen and ink, charcoal, etc.

Painting

Painting works on developing basic painting skills and techniques. Students explore with watercolor, tempera and acrylic in creating original personal images.



Ceramics

Ceramics is a class in which original utilitarian pottery pieces are created with clay using hand- building methods such as pinch, slab and coil and various glazing techniques.

Sculpture

Students focus on three-dimensional artwork that uses a variety of sculptural methods such as carving, assembling, modeling, and casting. Students use a variety of tools and materials including, but not limited to, foam board, clay, crea-stone, and plaster.



Advanced Drawing

Advanced Drawing is a college-prep-level art course that focuses on developing observational skills and illustrative techniques. This course explores complex subject matter like the human figure, high-contrast lighting, perspective, etc. Students critique, adjust, prep and collect artwork to provide themselves with a strong base for a portfolio.



Art Fundamentals

This course emphasizes a study of the elements of art and principles of design. Students explore, organize and create two and three-dimensional original work in various forms and media. Understanding the elements and principles of art is imperative for a strong art foundation.



COURSE INFORMATION

Studio Art

This course concentrates on students learning how to work with multiple materials, in an environment focused on art making processes and techniques. Students mix materials and show many viewpoints of one subject to show how diverse making art can be. An example would be the Trptych project permanently displayed in the high school senior lunch areas. Students will learn the value behind the thought process of art making, and approach new work in a deeper way.

Digital Media Arts

The Digital Media Arts Program at LMHS is a satellite program of the Warren County Career Center. It uses Adobe Creative Suite to give students hands-on and practical experience in photography, graphic design, video production, and animation. The program offers three courses: Intro to DMA, an entry-level introductory course, and the block program featuring DMA 1 and DMA 2. Students in the block program are able to develop a deep knowledge base of the Adobe programs and the techniques to succeed in them. Students create logos, music videos, photo edits, and so much more. The DMA 2 class is responsible for the creation of The Panther Show, an award-winning production, now in its third season, that serves as a learning lab for video production in the program and is frequently viewed by students, staff and community members.

The DMA Sports Video Crew is a select group of students who volunteer to help capture select events at LMHS. The crew is composed of upper-classmen who have demonstrated skills and interest in video production through the DMA program. The students are all volunteers who use their skills to capture events at a high level. The team of students man various cameras with various roles at events, which helps propel productions to the next level.



The commitment of the crew has been evident, being at every home football game the last three seasons, taking part in the 2023 Homecoming Parade to capture footage, covering various sporting events throughout the school year and even streaming a girls' lacrosse game in the spring of 2023.



COURSE INFORMATION

Little Miami Chorale

The Little Miami Chorale (formerly known as Select Women's Chorale) was established in 2003 as an extra-curricular ensemble. It was added to the daily schedule in 2005. The LM Chorale is the premiere performance ensemble at Little Miami High School, earning consistent Superior ratings in Ohio Music Education Association events. Maintaining a demanding schedule throughout the community, the chorale is a frequent guest of local and regional organizations and special military ceremonies conducted at the Ohio State Capitol.

Honors include invitations to perform at the Ohio Music Education Association and American Choral Directors Association conferences, World Choir Games Champions Divisions in Cincinnati and Riga, Latvia, the premiere Music for All National Choir Festival, University of Cincinnati-CCM Feast of Carols, and the May Festival Chorus 25 for 25 Community Choral Showcase. The Little Miami Tour Chorale, an expansion of the LM Chorale which includes present members and alumnae, has earned Gold medals and championships in the Female Choir and Spiritual categories, making Grand Prix appearances in Musica Mundi International Choir Festivals in Rome and Berlin.



The Little Miami Select Mixed Choir was created in 2007 to allow the men of the LMHS choir program to perform at a more challenging level with mixed choir repertoire. The ensemble was added to the curriculum in 2010. Since its beginning, the select mixed choir has grown to earn superior ratings at OMEA district and state-adjudicated events while also traveling with the LM Chorale to perform in local and regional events, choral festivals, and tours. Having enjoyed domestic tours to Chicago, New York City, Nashville, Louisville, Indianapolis, Cleveland and Philadelphia, the select choirs returned to Chicago in March 2024 for an exciting tour, performing in venues including the Field Museum and Vandercook College of Music.



This year's LM Select Choirs were honored with invitations to perform with the Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra's performance of Cecilia McDowell's *The Girl from Aleppo* and the *Walk with Little Amal* events at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center and the *We Are One: HOPE* presentation held at St. Catharine of Siena Church, the 2023 UC-CCM Feast of Carols, and the Comstock Chamber Choir Festival sponsored by the University of Louisville Cardinal Singers.

COURSE INFORMATION

6th Grade band

Sixth grade band is for students who are learning to play an instrument for the first time. Students will learn to form an embouchure (shape of the mouth), properly hold the instrument, make beginning sounds and learn to read and count music. Students will learn a large amount of skills in a very short time. Students are expected to practice outside of class to fully develop their skills and understanding. Students will perform in approximately two concerts per year.



Middle School Concert Band (Grades 7 & 8)

Middle school concert band is for students who have successfully completed the 6th grade band class. Students will refine and develop their playing skills and expand their musical vocabulary. Scale knowledge will increase to include 5 Major Scales and a one-octave Chromatic Scale. They will perform music with a difficulty level of 1-2. Students must participate in at least three concerts a year and are expected to practice outside of class to develop their skills and understanding fully.

Middle School Symphonic Band

Middle School Symphonic Band is for students who have successfully auditioned to participate in this ensemble after completing 6th-grade band class. Students will refine and develop their playing skills and expand their musical vocabulary. Scale knowledge will increase to include 12 Major Scales and a one-octave Chromatic Scale. They will perform music with a difficulty level of 2-2.5. Students must participate in at least three concerts a year and are expected to practice outside of class to develop their skills and understanding fully.

Little Miami High School Marching Band

The Panther Band is a dancing band similar in style to the Ohio University Marching 110. We perform several shows in a season, requiring us to learn many field maneuvers and memorize fifteen to twenty songs. Marching band is an important facet of our



school and community, meeting at regularly scheduled rehearsals and performing in several football games, parades and band festivals. The Little Miami Marching Band has a long and proud tradition, which has been developed by the hard work and dedication of many students, parents, and directors through the years.

The experiences encountered and the friendships developed are rewarding and last a lifetime.



TEACHERS - MUSIC

Tabitha Smith- High School Band/Marching Band, Middle School Band



Mrs. Smith has been teaching music and band for 28 years. She started her career at Valley View Local Schools in 1995, teaching general music, junior high band, and assisted high school band. In 2001, she came to Little Miami, where she taught elementary music at Butlerville Elementary, Morrow Elementary, and assisted the high school bands. Mrs. Smith became the high school band director in 2009. She directs the marching band, pep band, concert band and symphonic band. She also assists the

bands in grades 6-8 at the middle school. Since becoming band director, the marching band has continued to grow and is involved in many activities throughout the community and beyond. The symphonic band has gone to OMEA large group adjudicated events at the district and state levels and has received many superior ratings. Mrs. Smith was awarded the Project Excellence Foundation Award in 2017 and thanks God for the many blessings in her life.

Greg Robinson - Little Miami High School Music



A saxophonist, bassist and a 1983 Little Miami graduate, Greg has taught music at Little Miami Schools since 1991. Currently, he teaches classes at the high school, including Rock History, beginning guitar class, and Careers in Music. His past duties have included: 5th – 8th concert band, 7th – 8th jazz ensemble, K-8 general music, high school band assistant and 8th grade boys basketball. He was awarded the Project Excellence Award in 2007. His 8th grade jazz ensemble was chosen to perform at the Ohio Music Education Association convention in 2007 and 2010 with special guest bassist Victor Wooten.

Greg has played professionally including an appearance on The Grand Ole Opry, Kentucky Kingdom, Kings Island, Carnival Cruise lines, The Van Dells, Ooh La La, the Greasers, Soul Pocket, Robin Lacy & Dezydeco. He's performed the national anthem for the Cincinnati Reds and St. Louis Rams. He has also performed in groups that shared the stage with: The Four Freshman, Paul Revere and the Raiders, The Atlanta Rhythm Section and Blessid Union of Souls.

Kelly McKinley - Little Miami Primary School Music



Kelly McKinley has been teaching at Little Miami since 2000. She began her career at Maineville Elementary teaching grades K-4. She then moved to the Intermediate school in 2009 to teach 4th and 5th grades. She also taught 3rd and 4th grades at Salem Elementary. During the 2020/2021 school year, she taught music to grades 7-12. In 2021, she moved to LMPR to teach 2nd and 3rd grades. During her time at LM she's taught every grade except 6th!

Molly McCoy- Little Miami Middle School Band Director

Molly McCoy is a graduate of Miami University and the University of Louisville, where she holds a Bachelor of Music in Music Education and a Master of Music in Wind Conducting, respectively. She has performed internationally as an oboist for the Casalmaggiore International Music Festival in Casalmaggiore, Italy, and the Classical Music Festival in Eisenstadt and Vienna, Austria. This is Molly's fifth year at Little Miami,

where she has taught music, beginning band, and choir. Molly currently directs the bands in grades 6-8 and is the assistant director for the high school bands. In her free time, she loves to bake cakes for local weddings, play disc golf with her husband and 1.5-year-old son and performs with local wind ensembles and theater companies.

Rob Ryan- Middle School Choirs & General Music

Mr. Ryan has been teaching music in the Little Miami Schools since 2003. He has taught Little Miami students in every grade level (except 4th), including five years as a certified Red Cross instructor! Currently, he serves as Director of all Middle School Choirs, a 6th Grade choir, a 7/8 Men's Choir, a 7th Grade Women's Choir and an 8th Grade Women's Choir. In addition to singing, he also teaches two general music classes on the ukulele. Mr. Ryan enjoys the challenge of getting students to perform various music together in a community setting. For many, these classes are an outlet they cannot find anywhere else.



Christina Burton- Little Miami Elementary School Music

Christina Burton is currently in her eleventh year of teaching music. She teaches music to grades four and five at Little Miami Elementary School. Her primary instrument is the clarinet, but she also enjoys playing piano and guitar. Mrs. Burton graduated from The University of Kentucky with a Bachelor of Music in Music Education. She was an active member of the UK Marching Band and Pep Band, where she served as Drum Major. Before her position with Little Miami, Mrs. Burton taught middle school and high school band at Taylor Middle School and High School on the west side of Cincinnati. She was named teacher of the year in her former district in 2019. Her ensembles went on to successfully perform at various OMEA-sanctioned events as well as MSBA competitions. Mrs. Burton currently lives in Fairfield with her husband, their two-year-old daughter, and their German Shepard, Maverick.

Sarah Baker - Little Miami High School Choirs/Music Theory



Sarah J. Baker began her teaching career in 1992, serving as director of choral music at Little Miami High School since 2001. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education from Muskingum University and a Master of Music in Choral Conducting from Ohio University, where she studied with Dr. Peter Jarjisian. Mrs. Baker finds joy as a collaborative pianist - most recently serving as accompanist for the District 13 Honor Choir. She may be best known for her work with the Little Miami Chorale (formerly

known as Select Women's Chorale), an ensemble she established in 2003. This ensemble performs throughout the region, engaging in nearly forty events per year, singing in choral festivals, engagements with local community choirs, and national and international travel. The Little Miami Tour Chorale, along with Chorale and Little Miami Select Mixed Choir members, serves as the demonstration ensemble for Baker's use of synesthesia (color and voice) to achieve balance and blend in the choral ensemble.

Professional honors include the Warren County Project Excellence Innovative Teacher Award, featured director Choral Director Magazine, the All-Ohio State Fair Youth Choir's Distinguished Service Award, and the Medal of Distinction from The Cardinal Chorale. Baker was appointed as a member of the ENVOY (Educators for National Voices of Youth) and designated a premiere conductor for the newly formed choral division of the Music for All National Choral Festival. She has served two terms as OCDA Southwest Region Chair and was honored to be named conductor of the 2019 OCDA Summer Conference Women's Honor Choir. Mrs. Baker lives in the village of Maineville with her husband, Andrew, and Clara, the youngest of their three children (who is also in the LM Chorale!). While not making music with LM students, tour chorale, and friends, Baker enjoys time riding horses and practicing hot yoga.

Jennifer Southwick - First Grade Music Teacher



Jennifer Southwick has been teaching music, both privately and in public education, since 1990. She started teaching at Little Miami in 2015, teaching both first and second grade. With the opening of LMECC for the 21-22 school year, she now teaches music to first grade students.

Prior highlights of her career include guest conducting national renowned children's choirs and university choirs at Syracuse University, where she attended both undergraduate and graduate school. the National Anthem at a Reds baseball game. She has a passion for music and hopes that one day, some of her students will find a calling in music.




TEACHERS - ART


Digital Media Arts 2 and tries to incorporate as many real world projects as possible into the classes.
